Life Question 01:

What does God expect all males to be?

I. To become a man, a male must develop his:

- A. _____ Life is inherently difficult, and perseverance is necessary not only to survive, but also to thrive. (James 1:3-4)
- B. Resiliency We need the ability to bounce back. Children will always fall in the process of learning to walk. In the same way, we will continue to make mistakes and choose to sin as we develop our manhood. (Acts 3:19-20; 1 John 2:1)
- C. Physical presence Our body must be strong for the challenges ahead. As we wrestle with life, the physical preparation and energy we have available often determines whether we succeed or fail. (1 Corinthians 6:19-20)

D. Self-control – There are many forces within us and outside of us that will battle for our attention and demand our involvement. A man controls his emotions and thoughts and carefully manages how he expresses them—real men always follow through on their beliefs and values.

(2 Peter 1:5-9; 1 Timothy 4:3-4)

E. Perceptiveness – A man is attuned to his environment, his own internal processes, and the messages and emotions of other people.
 (Ephesians 6:18)

- F. A man is able to process his natural fears and anxieties so he can move out of his comfort zone, take wise risks, challenge himself and follow God's call into the unknown.

 (1 Chronicles 28:20)
- G. Character A man acts with integrity, follows through on his promises, practices his principles, speaks truthfully, backs up his faith with actions and responds in respectful ways. Because his character is strong and immovable, he is able to make mature decisions that lead to success.

 (Romans 5:3-5)

God Wants Us To Be...? (Part 2)

Life Question 02:

When you become a man of God, what challenges have you successfully dealt with?

- I. Manhood is _______, and there are several factors that can make achieving manhood even more difficult for us (Deuteronomy 30:15-18):
 - A. Many of us didn't have a father to set us an example of what Godly manhood is. (Psalm 27:10)
 - B. Some of us had a father who was very immature and had very little manly advice to pass on to us. (Proverbs 22:6)
 - C. We're distracted by short-term, pleasurable impulses that overshadow the self-discipline and self-control necessary to achieve manhood. (Amos 5:14-15)

A Manhood Story: Volume 01, Chapter 01

Every Tuesday, a group of men meet to learn about manhood through a Knights21 curriculum series, *The Heroic Man's Journey*. After listening to each lesson, these men (Joe, Chris, Bob, Chuck, José, Jim, Paul and George)¹ gather in their campfire discussion group to discuss the lesson and how it can be applied to their lives, explore the parts of themselves they may need to change and talk about life in general. Throughout *A Manhood Story*, we can see their relationships with each other progress and new relationships form, which allows each man to have new experiences, develop his character and ultimately step toward manhood.
